Aquarion Takes Part In No Child Left Inside Program *Company Sponsors Fishing Outing For Elementary Students*

Bridgeport, CT: May 23, 2007 – Aquarion Water Company today announced it will sponsor an educational fishing outing on Thursday, May 24th from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. along the Saugatuck Reservoir for three elementary classes from Bridgeport’s Cesar Battalia School.

Approximately 48 third-and-fourth-grade students will experience the fine, safe and ethical points of angling along the banks of the reservoir at 60 Newtown Turnpike in Redding, CT. The program will be coordinated and monitored by Fred Frillici, a long-time volunteer and certified instructor for the Connecticut Aquatic Resources Education (CARE) program.

“For many years, Aquarion has sponsored similar events for students at the Barnum School and we are happy to be able to continue to extend a helping hand to children so that they can develop a respect for the environment and the beautiful world around them,” said Aquarion Manager of Natural Resources Stephen C. Stamos.

The CARE program is comprised of free classes and outdoor workshops which help foster resource stewardship, promote an understanding of aquatic systems and fishery management decisions and encourage both an understanding and utilization of aquatic resources. CARE provides rods for the children to use and Frillici teaches students the important benefits of fishing and its impact on the water environment. Recently, Governor M. Jodi Rell recognized Frillici for introducing more than 3,000 students to the waters and fish of Connecticut.
